Many thanks for your letter and for the biographical details. I am afraid the honorary FRCPs are very seldom awarded and then mainly to people, often non-medical, who have made distinguished contributions in paramedical fields - for example, Dorothy Hodgkin was made a Fellow for her work on the structure of insulin.

It is possible to be elected an MRCP under a special bye-law for those who have not taken the examination, and this is the normal procedure for medical men and women who have had a successful career in some branch of medicine. If the Membership is awarded, then one can be put up for Fellowship after four years. It is my impression that the College seldom so elects members from overseas, and, if they did so, they would need considerable support from their own country from Fellows of our College.
